
Understanding the Language of Parkinson's Treatment



The following are terms healthcare providers commonly use. Knowing what they mean will help you have better conversations with your doctor.





Dyskinesia

"On" time and "Good On" time

"Off" time

Time (years)

1 Dyskinesia

medicine is working but level of levodopa is too high—and you may experience involuntary movements you can't control

2 "On" time

medicine is working, and your symptoms are well-controlled

"Good On" time

medicine is working, and you are not experiencing movements you can't control or they are not impacting your daily activities

3 "Off" time

medicine no longer works, and symptoms return

Understanding carbidopa/ levodopa (CD/LD) options



Immediate-release CD/LD:

the most commonly used form of levodopa. Immediate-release means the levodopa is released immediately after it is taken so that it can start to work quickly

Controlled-release CD/LD:

controlled-release means that the levodopa is released slowly which takes it longer to start working. Controlledrelease CD/LD has been shown to be no more effective than immediaterelease CD/LD

Extended-release CD/LD:

a newer form of CD/LD that contains both immediate- and extended-release components. This allows extendedrelease CD/LD to work quickly and sustain levodopa levels for longer than other levodopa formulations. It has also been shown to be more effective at controlling motor function than immediate-release CD/LD
